DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by Waiau Bowling Club Incorporated for renewal of an Club Licence in respect of premises situated at 9 Parnassus Street, Waiau, known as "Waiau Bowling Club".

The applicant also seeks to vary the licensed areas. The applicant did not initially seek changes to the licence conditions. However, during the site visit the use of the area around the bowling green was discussed. Some bowlers watch games from the shelters around the green and like to have a drink there. It was indicated that the licensing of these areas would be appropriate for the club.

The club-licence hours are:

Monday to Sunday from 10.00am to 7.00pm up to a maximum of 40 hours per week.

The granting of these licensed hours are conditional on a record of the bar opening and closing hours being kept.

The operational hours for the bar are recorded in a diary which is kept at the bar.

The licensed areas are undesignated and include:

- The interior of the club rooms, and
- The grassed and paved area in front of the clubrooms and around the bowling green.

The applicant has traded as the Waiau Bowling Club Incorporated under the club-licence since September 2015.

The bowling club was closed for approximately two years when the building was red stickered after the November 2016 earthquake. The building is nearing the end of the earthquake repairs.

This is an outdoor bowls club and is closed over the winter between April and late September each year.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

In their reports, the Police, Medical Officer of Health, and District Licensing Inspector have raised no matters in opposition to this application.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act. We renew the licence until 23 September 2022, that being the anniversary date of the licence and three years from the most recent date of expiry.

Due to a practice direction from the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority we authorise the issue of a replacement licence with a new number and notice of renewal.
