DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by Salt n Pepper Cafe Limited for renewal of an On-Licence in respect of premises situated at Chisholm Crescent, Hanmer Springs, known as "Salt n Pepper Cafe".

No changes to the conditions of the licence have been sought by the applicant.

Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) initially advised that an evacuation scheme was not necessary for the premises, but this was queried due to the fact that the café is part of a larger complex building, employing more than 10 staff.

Fire Risk Management Officers from FENZ are working with the building owner on the development and approval of the Evacuation Scheme. Any opposition to the application has been withdrawn from FENZ, as they continue to talk to Boulder Point precinct.

Salt n Pepper Cafe Limited has traded as Salt n Pepper Café for a year, in the new Boulder Point retail complex in Hanmer Springs. The café/restaurant caters for both the local community and visitors to the area with a focus on families.

The applicant has a commercial lease for 6 years, with two rights of renewal of six years each.

Katrina Burrow is the sole director of Salt n Pepper Limited. She and her husband Brendon Burrow are the shareholders.

There has been a large turnover of duty manager's at the premises over the past year. Currently there are two duty managers who hold manager's certificates.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

In their reports, the Police, Medical Officer of Health, and District Licensing Inspector have raised no matters in opposition to this application.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act. We renew the licence on the existing terms and conditions until 18 December 2021, that being three years from the first anniversary of the licence.

Due to a practice direction from the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority we authorise the issue of a replacement licence with a new number and notice of renewal.
