



- Funding




Figure 1: Comparison of new NZSeaRise projections with 2017 coastal hazards guidance projections from 2000 to 2150

SLR scenarios: 2017 MfE guidance vs NZSeaRise (national-average)








Draft objectives:

- Maintain a well-functioning coastal dune system and continue to promote biodiversity.




Phase three: What can we do about it?

Site specific inundation protection – raising floor heights or waterproofing










Coastal protection – dune maintenance vs beach scraping


