N. Freedom Camping Bylaw Review.

Submission

Now aged 66 years I first began caravanning with my parents + sibling 55 years ago in North Auckland. Then it was tenting + now I am a financial member of the NZ Motor Caravan Assn. (Inc) NZMCA, member number #79,003, + also have friends park overnight on the farm while passing by Hennenden, North Canterbury.

The Freedom Camping Bylaw within the Hawke's Bay District Council geographic area is important, + a review with the new bylaw under the Freedom Camping Act is important & I agree, but also offer additional information to be addressed.

Being part of the NZ MCA means you adhere to strict rules re parking, alcohol consumption on site, activities. There are now 50,000 members of this organization + has assets of more than \$11.5 million. There is a network of NZMCA Parks etc, NZ + local North Canterbury Rallies, Regular magazines, product information available, etc. Within the Hawke's Bay District we have P.O.P. (Park Over Properties) + designated NZMCA areas eg Hennenden Memorial Park, etc.

There are designated parking overnight areas throughout NZ. There are blue / white signs on posts between which vehicles park between 4 pm - 9 am. only. Nothing would look worse than travellers eg camped by toilets at Waikeri, or Culverden during the day adjacent to public toilets + shops. eg non-compliant self-contained vehicles as in Hawke's Bay District Council proposal.

Number 2. Everyone must be moved on / gone by 9 am. It would be ideal to have power point outlets in designated park / off-road areas. Ideally have designated areas adjacent to service areas as in Waihi Returned Services Cenpark there is access to the RSA sport facilities + restaurant.

There could be reciprocal membership between "UK/Australia
Motorhome Owners" members with NZ.

There is a Motorhome Assn. subgroup for "few wheelers"
that is solo people so as they can camp in the vicinity
of other solo participants.

- * The NZ MCA has purchased its own parks throughout NZ,
members of NZMCA regularly have weekends / days where
members can park up collectively and do collections
of rubbish in public areas, beach sides, etc Spring Clean-Ups.
- * NZMCA Green fund personnel also plant trees - eg
every 750 km plant 1 tree (NZMCA Magazine Issue 33
June/July 2018. + gives grants eg \$10,000 for tree planting).
- * Dogs are generally not allowed un-leashed in parking areas.
- * Effluent disposal stations need to be located in appropriate places.
It is felt that there does need to be rules within our
Thurunui District self-contained vehicles, non-self
contained vehicles + tents (Categories 1, 2 and 3) also
need to be monitored.
