

Residential Pool Barrier Inspection Report 2022 - 23

Hurunui District Council, as a territorial authority, is required under section 162D of the Building Act 2004 to ensure that residential pools are inspected at least once every three years to determine whether the pool barriers comply with the legislative requirements.

To meet this requirement the Council carries out pool barrier inspections during spring and summer each year. This report covers inspections carried out between 1 October 2022 and 1 March 2023.
