DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by Scargill Golf Club Incorporated for renewal of an Club Licence in respect of premises situated at Scargill Valley Road, Scargill, known as "Scargill Golf Club".

The applicant also seeks a variation of hours.

The current licensed hours held are:

Monday to Sunday 12 midday to 10.00pm up to a maximum of 40 hours per week

The new hours sought are:

Monday to Sunday 11.00am to 10.00pm up to a maximum of 40 hours per week

The Inspector considers these club-licence hours are appropriate for the premises to allow flexibility for tournaments, while still limiting the maximum trading hours. The club bar is typically only open an average of 5 hours per week.

The bar trading hours are to be recorded in a book which is kept at the club, to provide evidence that the 40 hours per week criteria has been met.

The club is reminded that the club-licensed hours are for club related activities only. When the club bar is open for other events a special licence would be required.

The licensed areas are all undesignated and include:

- The interior of the clubrooms including the kitchen, and
- The outdoor paved area in front of the clubrooms, and

• A wooden deck area at the back of the clubrooms. This will be approximately 20m by 20m and have built-in seating around the edges.

New security measures are being incorporated into the re-building of the club premises:

- CCTV cameras will be installed on the four corners of the building. The areas covered will include the office area where the green fees are paid, the storage shed and the car park area.
- There will also be a security light on at all times on the outside of the building.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

In their reports, the Police, Medical Officer of Health, and District Licensing Inspector have raised no matters in opposition to this application.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act. We renew the licence until 02 June 2022, that being the anniversary date of the licence and three years from the most recent date of expiry.

Due to a practice direction from the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority we authorise the issue of a replacement licence with a new number and notice of renewal.
