DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by Georges Road Vineyard Partnership for renewal of an Off-Licence in respect of premises situated at 625 Mt Brown Road, Broomfield, known as "Georges Road Wines".

No changes to the conditions of the licence have been sought by the applicant.

The licensed hours held are:

Monday to Sunday from 10.00am to 4.00pm

Georges Road Vineyard Partnership trades as Georges Road Wines. Georges Road Wines has held alcohol licences since September 2016 however, the licences were, at times held under a company name and for remotes sales only.

The members of the partnership are; Kirk Bray and Alison Schroeder. Kirk is the sole director of company.

The tastings are by pre-booked appointments and for small numbers of patrons. Kirk advised tastings are often for 2 to 4 people with up to 8 or 9 people. No other staff are involved at the wine tastings. All tastings are free and for limited serves, i.e. 5 servings of 50mls as the winery only produces 5 varieties of wine.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

The Inspector has reported that the website is currently non-compliant, as a copy of an old licence is displayed.

The website must be updated with all the new licence details, including a copy of the new licence, within 2 working days of these being issued.

Failure to do so, will result in further action being taken, unless the Secretary has been notified of a reason this cannot happen beforehand.

In their reports, the Police, Medical Officer of Health, and District Licensing Inspector have raised no matters in opposition to this application.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act. We renew the licence on the existing terms and conditions until 30 July 2022, that being three years from the first anniversary of the licence.

Due to a practice direction from the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority we authorise the issue of a replacement licence with a new number and notice of renewal.
