Our opposition is based on lack of parking for the fly ride, which means any guests we have will not be able to park outside our house in Oregon Heights.

Our quiet suburban street will have people and cars coming and going for up to 10 hours a day, with the ensuing noise and inevitable litter.

We are also concerned that congestion will have a negative impact on the value of our property. Your submission estimates that there will be 60 people (30 cars) per hour going on the fly ride. You state that this ride takes 70 - 120 seconds, but the participants still need to walk up the hill to the top of the fly ride and then walk down again. Maybe total time taken could be 1.5 hours per car park.

We conservatively estimate that 45 extra car parks would be required.

6. I seek the following decision from the consent authority: *

give precise details, including the general nature of any conditions sought

A separate parking facility should be made available for the fly ride.

With any new commercial development, the council always requires parking to be provided, including disabled parking. Why should this venture be treated any differently?

We strongly urge that this is a condition of the fly ride being approved.

If this cannot be done then we request 'residents car parking only' in Oregon Heights, with an assurance that this will be policed.
